Cecille Jacobsen Elected 2013-15 FAAGC President

ecille Jaccobsen was elected President of the Columbia Fil-Am Association during the election of FAAGC officers held at the annual spring picnic at Sesquicentennial State Park on Easter Sunday, April 24, 2013.

She now heads the 2013-2015 FAAGC Executive Board that blends experience, continuity and lots of new blood. The new board includes three officers from 2011-2013 Executive Board (two re-elected to the same positions, one elected to a new position), two other past officers, and seven first-time officers.

FAAGC Annual Gala Set for September 21

The Filipino-American Association of Greater Columbia (FAAGC) will celebrate its 23rd Annual Gala & 15th Induction Ball on September 21, 2013. The gala will be held from 6:00 p.m. to midnight at the downtown Columbia Marriott Hotel (1200 Hampton St., Columbia, SC 29201).

The formal affair (coat and tie or barong required) includes a sit-down dinner and an entertainment program featuring Philippine folk dances performed by **four** generations of Fil-Ams in the Columbia Fil-Am Cultural Dance Troupe. Dancers representing neighboring Fil-Am associations are also scheduled to perform. The newly-elected 2013-2015 Executive Board will be inducted into office and the new lifetime members and Fil-Am scholarship recipients will be recognized.

Until September 14, tickets are \$50 per adult (\$35 per student). After September 14, tickets are \$60 per adult (\$45 per student). Tickets for children ages 8-12 years are \$25 each. There is a 5% discount for a full table of 10. For a small fee, baby-sitting services for children aged 2 to 8 will be available on-site so parents with small children can enjoy the festivi-

FAAGC Officer Honored as CIF 2013 "International Volunteer of the Year"

lma Talens Robichaud. a newly-elected **FAAGC** Executive Board Member, was named the 2013 "International Volunteer of the Year" during the 18th annual Columbia International Festival (CIF) held

on April 13-14, 2013.

The annual award is given to a qualified, foreign-SC born resident who has used his/ her gifts/

talents/skills/resources to help the community in tangible ways, currently volunteers time/services without pay through a community-oriented service organization, and has served in this capacity for at least 10 years (in the Midlands or elsewhere).

Alma's selection marks the fourth time a Columbia Fil-Am has been honored as Volunteer of the Year, and the eighth time overall in the 18 years of the festival that a Columbia Fil-Am Association member has

been recognized.

"International Previous Volunteer of the Year" awardees were Noel Alon (FAAGC Lifetime Sustaining Charter member and Fil-Am Bulletin Editor), Grace Collins (2003-2005 FAAGC President), and Peter Liunoras (2001-2003 FAAGC President) in 1998, 2002, and 2004, respectively.

Dr. Francisco Sy (a longtime FAAGC benefactor and member and a former public health professor at USC), Dr. Nieves McNulty (1997-2001 FAAGC President and the math department chair at Columbia College), and Dr. Marj Peña (2009-2013 FAAGC President and biological sciences associate professor and Mouse Core Facility director in the Center for Colon Cancer Research at USC) received the "International Professional of the Year" awards in 1997, 2001 and 2012, respectively.

Dr. George McNulty (2001 -2007 FAAGC Treasurer and math professor at USC) was named the "International Community Ambassador of the *Year*" in 2006.





Many of us also have the long black hair that is very feminine-looking. Our traditional Filipina look, as they say, sets us part from other races. I believe our uniqueness is something to celebrate.

It was named the summer capital of the Philippines via a resolution on June 1, 1903 by the American colonial governmen). Due to elevation, it is cooler in Tagavtav than in Metro Manila. Given its proximity to Metro Manila, Tagaytay is a convenient nearby destination for locals and tour-

ists who want a break from the

Some Thoughts on FILIPINO AMERICAN **HISTORY**

In 2009, both the United States Senate (on October 1) and House of Representatives (on November 2) passed simple resolutions officially recognizing October as Filipino American History Month. The month of October was chosen because the first recorded presence of Filipinos in the continental United States occurred on October 18. 1587, when some "Luzones Indios" came ashore from a Spanish galleon at what is now Morro Bay, California. That is 20 years before the English settlement at Jamestown and 33 years before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock.



In 1763. Filipinos established their first permanent settlement in the marshes and bayous of Louisiana. These Filipinos, also known as "Manila men," sought to escape the harsh working conditions aboard the Spanish galleons, and built houses on stilts along the gulf ports of New Orleans. These Filipinos were the first in the United States to introduce the sun-drying process for shrimp. And in 1781, a Filipino was chosen as a member of the first group of settlers to establish the city of Los Angeles, California

The early 1900s brought a wave of Filipino laborers to work on the Hawaiian pineapple and sugarcane plantations, California farms, Washington lumber mills, and Alaskan salmon canneries. This wave of immigrants also brought the "pensionados" from affluent families to be educated in the United States. Some of the laborers returned to the Philippines, but most found the wages too low to save money for a return voyage. In an effort to retain their cultural heritage, the Filipinos formed associations to conserve their identity. In 1912, the Filipino American Association of Philadelphia was founded and is perhaps the oldest Filipino organization in continuous existence in the United States.

Today there are nearly four million Filipino Americans in the United States. These are defined as immigrants from the Philippine Islands and their U.S.- born descendants.

Filipino Americans have made significant contributions in all facets of American life. A few examples:

- → Eduardo San Juan, the concept designer of the Lunar Rover (moon buggy) used in the NASA Apollo program on the moon in the early 1970s;
- ♦ Roman Gabriel, the first Asian-American to start as an NFL quarterback, who as the Los Angeles Rams quarterback was named the NFL MVP in 1969;
- ◆ Ben Cayetano, the first Filipino American governor of a state in U.S. history when he was elected governor of Hawaii in 1994;
- ◆ Lillian Lim, the first Filipina judge in the U.S., who retired in 2007 as a San Diego Superior Court of California judge.

And the list goes on and on. From all walks of life, Filipino Americans are making history every day. What kind of history will you make? Only time will tell.
